# Rev. Sarah and David Kitch 'Thank You' as their journey continues

Rev. Sarah and Chaplain David Kitch are about to take their colorful and rewarding lives

to a new destination . . . the bucolic Oregon coastal city of Seaside.

Their journey together started 45 years ago June 21. They had found each other and fell in love when they each joined the faith-based international professional theater ministry Covenant Players.

Sarah came naturally to theater. Her father was one of the first



producers for CBS, introducing people to television when it was just new. Her mother was a Broadway and radio actress, known particularly for her extensive career as the lead in the radio drama "The Romance of Helen Trent." After studying theater at Syracuse University, Sarah joined Covenant Players. David's background of being raised in a military family accustomed him to moving about, and his theater background in both dance and performance prepared him well for the Covenant Players.

During their time with the Players, they spent years based in Australia, and later in Germany. Their work took them to some 30 countries, including Brazil, China, Japan, India, South Africa, Guatemala, throughout Europe, and all 50 of the United States. They performed for audiences in the armed forces, hospitals, schools, retirement homes, churches, correctional facilities, and social service agencies. Their touring lifestyle took them from city to city, town to town, performing weekly for as many people as possible. The theater work finished, they knew they were both too young to retire.

Sarah and David had grown up in the Episcopal Church and both had an appreciation of liturgy and creative worship. As such, through a circuitous string of connections and events they encountered St. Francis and then vicar Rev. Steve Dean. It was Father Steve who ventured the question to Sarah if she had ever thought of Seminary. It was a bit of a gamble since Sarah had not been in school for some 40 years.

With David's encouragement, Sarah applied to Bloy House, the Episcopal Theological School at Claremont. She earned her first degree as a Vocational Deacon in 2010 and then served St. Francis alongside Father Steve for almost five years. It was during this time that the question of a call to the Priesthood became evident. Sarah returned to Seminary, finishing her degree and getting her Master of Divinity in 2015. She was Ordained in April as a Priest and called to serve St. Francis in May.



David also completed his

Master of Divinity in 2015 and went on to be a school chaplain. David served St. Martin's in the Field Episcopal School in Winnetka for six years, before moving to The Gooden School in Sierra Madre, where he is now entering his seventh year as chaplain and educator. David is a licensed lay preacher and catechist in the Diocese of Los Angeles, and was part of the founding

team of the Center for Lay Chaplaincy.

St. Francis became Sarah's church home in 2006. Members of the congregation became her discernment committee as she sought to become a Deacon.

"There are so many memories and precious relationships that David and I share from our journey with the St. Francis community," Sarah says.

"What a blessing to see the communal effort to develop the drought-tolerant landscaping -- appreciating the beauty and saving on water. What a joy to see the grounds cultivated to more of a contemplative space, with

work on the labyrinth, and developing a water feature. The delight and laughter of reaching into the community to start 'Jazz on the Patio' and to bring in great musicians -- originally from CSUN through our beloved Derek Silbermann, and since from a myriad of contacts until with Chris and Dan McCarty today.



"St. Francis has grown in strength and heart for God, and God's Kin-dom work. The involvement with the Baby Closet, the Samaritan Center, Hillsides, the outreach to the community, the Daughters of the King, the ECW, Sunday's hospitality after service, the music ministry, to name just a few communal activities. We will miss you but know you will take with you our love and wishes for incredible success in your new home."
























