
Power



Someone said to me the other day, "Pentecost is just one day, not a whole season." If we think of this day literally, yes that's true. It is the celebration of the birth of the church and the coming of the Holy Spirit's nature upon the disciples, to empower them to bring the Good News to all people. However, I like to consider that Pentecost is in fact a season – a season during Ordinary Time – that we would be conscious and grow in our understanding of the Holy Spirit. I wonder if the Holy Spirit is the part of the Trinity that we least draw upon because we feel we don't know it very well or experience it! Ah! That to me is our downfall in our teaching for without the Holy Spirit, we are unable to apprehend how alive God's presence is in our lives! That is the point. The Holy Spirit is like the nurturing mother around us all the time to empower us, to enrich us, to imbue in us the love of God, the mercy of God and the presence of God in and through us now!!!!

Too often we think only of the Holy Spirit as the "gifts of the Spirit", and that is only partly the story. For the Holy Spirit is the power in us that allows us to do the work of the Kin-dom today and tomorrow and the next day. Being a follower, a disciple of Jesus, is about our responsiveness to the needs of our community and being empowered to respond. What gives us the ability of that response is the Holy Spirit and we need to call upon her often and a lot because there is a lot of work to be done!!!









This season of Ordinary Time, may we be stirred by the Holy Spirit to be more conscience and aware of her presence. Let us learn more and dig deeper in our relationship with Jesus, that the Spirit of God is experienced with greater vitality and life within us. May we know how deeply loved we are by God and the community around us through the loving embrace of the Holy Spirit. Blessings always,

Feminine Incarnation

She Is Love

My God is a curvy black woman with dreadlocks and dark, cocoa-brown skin. She laughs from her belly and is unashamed to cry. She can rock a whole world to sleep, singing in her contralto voice. Her sighs breathe life into humanity. Her heartbreaks cause eruptions of justice and love.

Of course, because God is a mystery, we don't know everything about Her. So out of our imaginations and our yearnings, our hopes and our fears, we make stuff up. At our best, we project goodness, power, kindness, and love onto God. At our worst, we create a God who is punitive, angry, judgmental, and harsh. We do this because we are those things, and we think they make us safe.

Projection itself is not the problem. The problem occurs when we don't examine those projections with a critical eye, with a hermeneutic of suspicion. The trouble starts when our god is too small, when we reduce our worst projections to fit in our pocket and keep this god on our team.

I know I've got my projections. They are inspired by my imagination and by textual studies. In Hebrew, the words for womb and mercy have the same root, and the word for spirit is feminine: *ruach*. In Greek, the word *pneuma* [breath or spirit or soul] has a feminine article, the word *Sophia* stands for wisdom, and the word *agape*—God's love for us—is also a feminine word. Therefore, my God is an incarnate feminine power, who smells like vanilla and is full of sass and truth, delivered with kindness. She'll do anything for her creation; her love is fierce. She weeps when we do and insists on justice. She is God. She is Love.



Seeking a deeper path? Spiritually hungry for more? Looking for companions? Stillpoint invites you to join others for a Spiritual Journey.

What is the Spiritual Journey program?

An eight-month exploration of your spiritual life in a small group setting, deeply enriching your relationship with The Divine and helping you recognize the ways that God/Spirit is present and working in your life.

What is the commitment?

The program consists of eight five-hour sessions that meet once a month. Sessions include practice in forms of prayer and contemplation, time for personal reflection, sharing in pairs and triads, experience-based learning, and group discussion of readings.

What does it cost?

There is \$25 application fee + a \$400 tuition fee which includes all instruction, facilitated group interaction, and private sessions with faculty (does not include books).

Who should come?

This program is open to people of all denominations and faiths who are seeking to go deeper in their spiritual walk. We are rooted in the Christian tradition and welcome a diverse and inclusive learning community.

When and where does it happen?

Classes begin on Saturday, September 14, 2019, with future dates to be scheduled by each group. Small groups are planned for Claremont, Orange County, Pasadena, Riverside, Simi Valley, and Studio City.

How do I register?
