Hello Everyone! There is good news in the garden today. Here are the changes coming up for our church grounds:

- New low use watering system in the biblical garden. I will be replacing the plants we lost as well as adding more. New signage that will hopefully stand up to the traffic back in that part of the landscape.
- 2. Sprinkler repairs near the labyrinth so we can add some perennial blooms to enhance the peace and enjoyment for those using the labyrinth.
- 3. The water to the grass in front of the office has been turned off. This area is going to be rototilled and mulched. A fun swing is going to be hung from one of the trees there. I am looking for ways to draw children out into the garden while maintaining our natural aesthetic.
- 4. The water to the west of the central path in front of the church has been turned off. This will allow more water time to go to the largest section of grass in the front and also to the grass near the courtyard. Fortunately we are receiving another monetary donation, which will allow us to add new irrigation and low water use plants to this area.

Our grounds are going to be a beautiful example to those visiting the church of what can be done responsibly in a low water use garden. Thank you so much to the people whose donations have made this possible!
