From our Vicar... June 2017



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We have been celebrating Eastertide and the glorious resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Fifty Days have passed and now we come to Pentecost where we join with all the saints praising God for the birth of the Church. Pentecost Season turns us into the renewed energies of the community and witness as Christ followers.

As we follow our liturgical season, Pentecost allows us to consider what we have renewed in our faith walk. Are we practicing spiritual disciplines that awaken us to a revived sense of community and the church? What of our prayer life? Are we remembering those whom we name each Sunday in our prayers? In our weekly devotion, do we seek to be in fellowship one with another here at church? Where are we placing our priorities and our focus?

We live in a fast paced culture that demands our attention every moment. Breaking news comes on our phones, social media pressures us to keep up with all our relationships throughout our life, and our schedules fill up every spare minute. I wonder if this is truly what God intends for us as we live as followers of Christ, who took many times out of the day to pray, to be with people, to celebrate, to laugh, to hold children, and to sit and look at the stars.

We as a church carry a message of hope, of abundant life, care, compassion, and love. These things take time. They take prayer. They take stepping outside of the hustle and bustle and ask for attention in quiet reflection. That is our witness as a church.

Easter calls us to look anew at the Resurrection in our lives. Pentecost asks us to consider our witness as believers. This season of Pentecost may we consider taking time, and making a commitment to break the demand for speed and productivity, the compulsive "busyness?" May we practice the Spiritual Discipline of E-Sabbaths – turning off our computers, phones, TV, for a time during the day, and giving ourselves renewed rest in nature, with friends, with someone special?



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What difference would it make in your life if you redirected these energies and took this time to witness to God's love all around you, God's beauty, and God's Grace?

Putting my money where my mouth is, here are a few suggestions for this Pentecost Season in renewing our energies and time management.

- 1. walk the Labyrinth here at St. Francis after church. Give yourself a break during the day and get out of your office. Walk the neighborhood around your place of work. Go outside and stretch in the middle of the day. Leave your cell phone behind.
- 2. Find yourself a book of poetry that you can read during the day. Stop your busyness and take ten minutes to read poems or prose. When you finish the poem, sit quietly and allow it to wash over you. Wonder what catches your attention about the poem? Commit to reading it daily.
- 3. At least once in the morning, once in the afternoon, and again at night, give thanks to God for the moments you have lived. Think of a couple of mundane tasks that you have done and give God thanks for being able to do them. Thank God for being alive. Give God gratitude for the people you meet in a day all of them even the ones that you know are difficult. Give yourself the opportunity to smile as you think of how many people you know and love in your life.
- 4. Eat something with lots of flavor.

 Crunching an apple and savoring its goodness. Drink a glass of cold water and feel how refreshing it is. Notice how eating gives you renewed energy. Taste your food. Allow yourself to take time eating. Appreciate those who have made the food. Thank God for Creation.
