From Our Vicar...

Do not now seek the answers, which cannot be given you because you would not be able to live them.

And the point is, to live everything. Live the questions now.

Perhaps you will then gradually, without noticing it, live along some distant day into the answer." - Maria Ranier Rilke

We are now in the season of waiting and giving ourselves forty days of quiet attention to our lives. It is Lent. The word Lent means lengthening and so it is the lengthening of the days of Spring. Light is coming, but not yet. We hold this time in reverent honor and allow ourselves to reflect on our patterns, habits, choices, desires and routines.

If we give ourselves time to reflect, we might explore questions such as "is this what I want to give my time, talents, and treasure?" The practice of fasting from some pattern of behavior, or habit, is to give an opportunity to consider what we might do with the time or space that is available. Perhaps in the quiet attention, questions come up that we have not considered. Can we embrace these questions like "locked rooms and like books that are written in a foreign language", that might yet be explored?

Even, what it means to live the questions, now. If there is absence of something, what is it that I might consider giving myself towards during this time? Is there some bidding invitation of something I might do that I haven't done that might be for this time? Volunteering? Planning a visit to someone? Writing that journal, you keep putting off? Participating in some spiritual discipline that you haven't done?

If Lent is lengthening than it is going toward the light of the day. I like to consider that whatever practice I take on is doing just that. It is that I am living along some distant day into the answers to some of my questions. Can I make a quest during this Lenten Season? Perhaps a quest of questions that I don't know the answers, but I'm willing to journey with during this time.

Let this season of Lent be an invitation of Jesus' love for you as we journey with Jesus to the Cross. May it be a love relationship that is calling you to fall deeper in love with yourself, with God and with your community. See where it takes you as you open yourself to the Spirit's leading in the quiet. Indeed, you will find yourself in the answer that God's love embraces all around you, right where you are now.

"Self-fulfillment, Jesus Says, Comes through Letting Go, Relinquishing our Need to Control and Define, to Manipulate And Possess. Self-fulfillment comes through Laying Down Our Lives in Obedience to God's Deepest Yearnings for Us."

The above quote from Brother David Vryhof of the Society of Saint John the Evangelist in Boston, Massachusetts, seems very appropriate for the month of March as we lean into Lent.

"Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencton — meaning "spring" or "lengthening" from the time of year when the days grow long. In 2023, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 22) and ends with the Easter Triduum (Maundy Thursday through Easter Day), covering 40 days (excluding Sundays which are little feasts of the Resurrection). Some believe that the word "Lent" may derive from the Latin lentare, which means "to bend." This understanding reinforces a sense of Lent as a time of preparation for personal and collective transformation. Having nurtured ourselves through Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, Lent becomes the time to look truthfully at ourselves and consider change.

This is our opportunity to take a look truthfully at ourselves and move into developing changes and growth. As we quiet ourselves during this Season, we listen more to the Holy Spirit, and the nudges that get our attention. We might consider our readings and take time to reflect and practice Lectio Divina (Holy Reading) during this time, reading a passage and asking "what catches my attention?" We might hold a time of quiet prayer as a discipline this Lent or participate with Centering Prayer or our Taize Service.

However, we enter into this Season of reflection and self-introspection with God, it is a time that we lay down our lives of busyness and bustle and let our deepest yearnings be attended. What is it that you long for? What is it that doesn't seem to be resolved or reconciled in your life?

Take this Season quietly and intentionally. Let the Holy Spirit guide you as you seek God and give God your heart, once again, to God's great Love. Peace be with you always.


