

If we are seeking a discipline during Lent, may we seek such a practice moving forward and deeper in our relationship with Jesus.

In other words, whatever we choose, may it bring us forward in our spiritual growth. I am inclined to hope that the time I spend not doing something is releasing me to find a discovery and surprise in greater relationship with all that I love.

I was reflecting on this in terms of relationships that are particularly meaningful. I long to make time to be with these relationships. I laugh easily with them. I am vulnerable. I am fully alive to find new things about them and myself. Shouldn't it be as such as we delve into a deeper spirituality?

Jesus teaches us about God and himself in such simple ways. He says "consider the birds", "consider the lilies." If we let ourselves pay attention to what is around us in our life, how are those things speaking to us of our love relationship with Jesus? Are we falling in love with Jesus everyday through a sunset, a kind word spoken to us, a hug, a loving smile from someone? That's Jesus all around us.

LITURGY LEXICON FOR LENT

Lexicon: the vocabulary of a person or language.

You will notice in our Lenten Bulletin that we have chosen some different wording for some of the phrases we are familiar and have said since we were baptized. In the Doxology for instance, a very familiar part of the liturgy that we have memorized and don't even think about what we are communicating. We say, "Praise God for whom all blessings flow, praise him all creatures here below. Praise him above ye heavenly hosts. Praise Father, Son and Holy Ghost." Ever notice how much the vocabulary, the lexicon of the Doxology carries with it a masculine pronoun? Is God male? What is the message we are sending when we say these words by wrote without thinking about what we are communicating? Who are we including and who are we excluding? Words are like suitcases. They carry with them images and vestiges of clothing that may or may not fit anymore, or at least, need to be altered. Maybe we haven't ever thought about this before. That is part of the Lenten Discipline that we are growing. It may be a new idea or a larger concept of our image of God, our relationship with God, our neighbor and ourselves. Language is one way that can stir us as we think about what we are communicating in our worship. If you have questions or are stirred by these alterations in this Season of Lent, please talk with Vicar Sarah. We welcome growing together.

If you know of people getting married, please tell them that this is a place worth looking at.




Playground Stuff Needed, or "How St. Francis can be as cool as Hogwarts."
