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Trust says the crumpled green license plate that hangs in my office. Trust what? Trust that it is worth scratching on the wall that God Is Love and Life because, all appearances to the contrary notwithstanding, it may just be true. Trust that if God is anywhere, God is here, which means that there is no telling where God may turn up next – around what sudden bend of the path if you happen to have your eyes and ears open, your wits about you, in what odd, small moments almost too foolish to tell. If God is ever, God is now, in the in and out of breathing, the sound of the footsteps on the stair, the smell of the rain, the touch of a hand on your bare shoulder where you kneel at the door. If God lives and loves, as the hay shed proclaimed, it is in ourselves no less than everywhere else, in the godless no less than the godliest, in the dead no less than the living, because the end of a life is no more likely to be the end of God's love that keeps it alive than it is of our love that keeps it a living part of ourselves the way Naya remains as much a part of me as she was before that night in her ninety-fourth year when the Toonerville Trolley of the world slowed down enough for her to dismount at last.

Trust beckons us to believe in the impossible, and hardly possible to see something magnificent just beyond reach. We are walking the path of the cross and hardly know what awaits us through the cross, just beyond the horizon, that we cannot see yet, but long to touch. We are invited into the mystery of trust deeper. We are beckoned by the Spirit's love to extend ourselves to know that "if God is ever, God is now, in the in and out of breathing, the sound of footsteps on the stair, the smell of the rain, the touch of a hand on your bare shoulder where you kneel at the door." Trust, which means there is no telling where God will show up next.

The Enneagram acts as a unique tool for understanding and explaining human behavior, the underlying motivations that drive behavior, and the gifts we all have for the transformation of non-productive encounters with others.

Whether you're new to the Enneagram or not, this retreat will provide the basic tenets of the Enneagram system and how knowing ones-self can allow us to lead more whole lives, while also going deeper into stance work.

Enneagram wisdom shows our unique imbalance in the three centers of intelligence: thinking, feeling and doing.

Learning to balance these three centers frees up enormous amounts of physical, emotional, and spiritual energy.

#### LOVE GIVEN AWAY

As a Chaplain at St Patrick's Episcopal Day School, I am asked to explain various concepts and liturgical seasons of the church. Recently, of course, we had Ash Wednesday. Now Ash Wednesday is not something that every tradition of the Christian Church observes. Usually, it is familiar to the Catholic Church, the Lutheran Church, the Episcopal Church, but many denominations do not set this day apart. So, in explaining it to the students at St Patrick's we are often seeking to help them understand the concept of love given away, such as the cross and Jesus' life for us. We

combine this effort with the idea of "Pay It Forward." Pay It Forward represents us doing something for others and giving ourselves away because of God's Love for us.

At St Francis, I would like to ask if you would consider a Pay It Forward project with me. We are so blessed with our facilities and the community outreach we offer to use the fellowship hall, the sanctuary, not to mention the grounds outside.

St Francis needs to replace our white round tables to better accommodate events and outreach that we offer through the year. We have investigated the brand LIFETIME and learned that we are able to purchase 12 round tables, with a cart to hold them, for \$2400.00.

This is our Pay It Forward project. I would like to invite you this Lent to consider prayerfully a one-time gift towards this project for replacing our tables. Please feel free to call and talk with me about this idea if you have any questions. We bless the work of the Spirit among us and are excited to see what God can do.

It is the privilege of St Francis to provide monies now in support of the work of The Bridge. We are deeply blessed to continue to make education for children a priority for our Mission Outreach. As our ministry in Belize comes to a close this year, we are so grateful to resource this work in Colombia. Please read about this work. Offerings will be taken in church each month as we bless and pray for this ministry through our outreach.

THE BRIDGE is a foundation which provides academic assistance to underprivileged children in Bogotá, Colombia. For those children fortunate enough to attend school, it provides resources to complete homework assignments and remedial help in reading, writing and mathematics skills. For those children who are currently unable to study due to a lack of openings in the public schools or a lack of proper documentation, The Bridge provides a place where children can study (homeschool style) until a vacancy becomes available to them.

Executive Directors for The Bridge are Anita and Lloyd Mix. They have been serving in Latin America for 34 years and have been centered in Bogotá for 28 years. For the last 13 years they have been partnering with Colombians working with high risk children. Sarah and David have know Anita and Lloyd for almost 40 years, and David has twice visited them in Bogotá.

#### From Anita:

It is our conviction that if we can help kids move forward with their education they will have more positive opportunities for their future. So our major emphasis will always be academic support. However, our purpose is to bear Christ's light in the darkness. So in and around the educational emphasis we love on the kids, have daily devotions and strive to build positive relationships with, and support for, parents and families. We have a library on campus as well as a large playroom. So a lot of life is lived within our walls when things are 'normal'.

The pandemic has been the cause for a lot of pivoting in how we accomplish our ministry, but we were able to shift gears and now provide homework assistance via phone, academic packets at the door and grocery distributions for our families in need. When the restrictions lessen we are able to bring in small groups of siblings in shifts and increase our personal contact.

In 2021, we anticipate helping as many as 150 children on a daily basis.

#### What is the church?

Paul opens his letter to the Ephesians with the magnificent blessing that places us in true position

to our Creator God. We are "blessed with every spiritual blessing," and then Paul recounts to us what every spiritual blessing is with seven verbs.

Blessed...chose...destined...bestowed..lavished...made known...gather up.

**Blessed**: We know the blessedness of God and then the blessing which is given to us because of God. We receive from God blessings of who God is! That changes our definition of blessing than what we might consider. We are blessed because we receive God's blessing of who God is.

**Chose:** With that blessing God chose us before the foundation of the world. You and I are chosen. We are in on the action of creation and we are part of the destiny of that creation.

**Destined:** There it is, destined, adopted as children through Christ. We are part of the good pleasure of God's will to be an active part of the Kin-dom Plan, from the very inception of Creation. "When God destines us, God marks out the boundaries in which we live the purposed life to which God appoints us."

**Bestowed:** Grace has been freely bestowed on us, that we walk in throughout our life, in the ordinary, everyday. Bestow is a noun that Grace is verbalized. Grace, one of the biggest blessings and gifts given to us to say you and I are GRACED!!!

**Lavished:** Ever found yourself just lavishing in a cool swimming pool, the ocean, a lake, where you have nothing better to do than just float and be surrounded by the water on a beautiful day? So that's the kind of grace that is lavished on us, and surrounds us, encompasses us, and we are recipients of God extravagance, God's Grace.

**Made known:** None of this is a secret. God has made known to us the mystery of God's will. That is God's desire to every one of us, that we are not in the dark. That we are living out God's wisdom and insight, in the knowledge of who God is, in the vitality and richness of God's Love.

**Gather up:** We are insiders in this Cosmic Story of Redemption. All these blessings are gathered up in Christ, and we are the living witnesses of this Resurrection Story. Read Ephesians 1: 3-14 with your name in it. You are living out the story of Resurrection.
