From Our Vicar...

One of my favorite seasons of the year is Thanksgiving. I wonder that we don't take enough time on purpose to be grateful. There are so many books written about the positive effects of gratitude on our brain and for our health. Truly, a heart of gratitude is a heart that is strong.

I think it is often easy to be grateful when things are going well, and we don't seem to have any dilemma's pending in our life. However, the practice of gratitude is finding thanks in the things that are more challenging, more difficult. We have to pay attention on purpose to see gratitude in those places.

Sometimes, I stop and ask God, "Show me how to see this." Or "Help me to know how to think about this." I ask God to give me insight – sight inward – that is beyond my seeing, or my way of thinking. I want to ask God for God's perspective and the Spirit's Grace for me to have a perspective and viewpoint that is bigger than my own.

It is an intention. I ask God for an intention of Gratitude. I am intentional to seek Gratitude. I want and anticipate something opening for me to see bigger, beyond my own finitude.

It is a conscious choice.

It is not incumbent on an outcome. It does not depend on being comfortable, or in a beatific place that lends my eyes to see gratitude.

It is a choice to have gratitude. I choose to be thankful always and everywhere because God is present, and where God is present there is Love. I look for where Love is showing up, where there is mercy, where there is Grace. I see beyond the circumstances and the situation and raise it up to God.

The experience often is something unexpected. There is a mercy that suddenly unfolds before me that I know I can rejoice. There is a grace that is present that I can receive and allow to raise my heart up in song. There is Love actively if I would but accept it.

This month let us lift up our hearts in gratitude. Look for opportunities that are more challenging and be deliberate about giving thanks. Ask God to show where you can see mercy, grace and Love. Let our hearts be glad in thanksgiving for all that God has given to us, all that God is for us, all that God is!

Please bring your diapers, wipes and baby toiletries in support of the Baby Closet on the 4th Sunday of the Month to help support the Baby Closet and their needs.

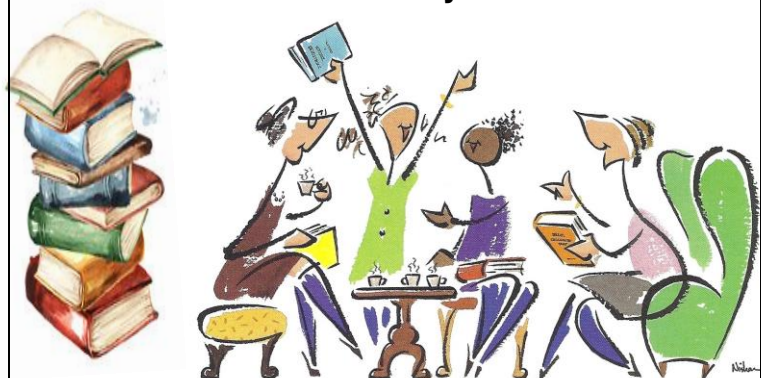

Being Faithful Stewards

When I look up the definition of Stewardship, it reads:

The job of supervising or taking care of something such as an organization or property; something entrusted to one's care.

As a congregation of St Francis, we are faithful stewards to care for the property and church that has been entrusted to us. Another word for stewardship is protector. We have been entrusted to protect this property, this building, this place. As stewards, we are given the ministry to protect the property for the community to come after us, for those who will worship here after we are long gone.

We are also given the ministry to be faithful to steward the property for the community now, and the outreach we extend for all to come and find peace and find God. Recently one of our recovery groups that meet here weekly had a Saturday retreat. Their words of gratitude and expression of thanksgiving for St Francis were so heartwarming.

"I just wanted you to know our day was AWESOME! We had a great turnout, and everyone loved the atmosphere and vibe the church provided for us. I can't thank you enough. The committee has a donation to the church for being so kind to us and giving us a wonderful place to have our event. Thank you and everyone at St Francis of Assisi."

They gave a donation of \$400.00. They too want us to steward, care for and protect this property to be a welcoming space for all. They feel deeply cared for when they are on the grounds, and deeply appreciate the space for their well-being and recovery journey.

St Francis offers available space for recovery groups, HOA's, homeschooling, retreats, weddings, memorial services, nutritional classes, resourcing the unhoused, and rentals for all occasions.

That's our outreach! As well of course, we extend ourselves through the Baby Closet, the ministry to families through our ECW dinner donations, Jazz on the Patio, Drumming Circles, Taize Services, Blessing of the Animals, Thanksgiving events, Christmas Vespers and Sing-alongs, Book Club, Healing Services, and the day-to-day presence of St Francis and the Holy Spirit here!

That's what we are stewarding.

As you receive the Stewardship Pledge Card again this year, please remember this is what St Francis is all about. Please seek the Lord for what you can contribute to bless St Francis for this next year and the years to come. Thank you.

A NOVEMBER SPIRITUAL PRACTICE

My friends, November is a month of gratitude and spiritual practices that help us to bless others along the way. This practice is something we can do anywhere, anytime. As you go about your day, say quietly this blessing for those you meet. Notice what happens for you as you do this practice for a day, a week, a month. See if your heart is also fuller for the gratitude you are receiving as you bless others.

One practice invites us to bless strangers quietly, secretly. Offer it to people you notice on the street, in the market, on the bus. "May you be happy. May you be at peace." Feel the blessing move through your body as you offer it. Notice how you both receive some benefit from the blessing. Gently, almost without effort, each and every blessing becomes a Sabbath.

What is Taíze?

On a hill in southern France, you'll find a community of brothers that has opened its doors to the world as an act of hospitality. There you are invited to pray, to be silent, to be simple, and to be faithful to meet God. There is a melodic holy rhythm to the everyday life. The community gathers to listen. The Scriptures are read and left to speak for itself in silence. Simple songs of prayer over and over calm the mind and open the soul.

This is the community of Taíze.

In Advent, we meet each week to gather and pray, to be silent, to be simple, and to be faithful to meet God. We have a simple service that leads us into listening. We listen to the Scriptures, and sit in silence. We sing simple songs of prayer to calm the mind and open the soul.

We invite you this Advent Season to take time out and allow yourself to meet with God.

Each Wednesday night at 6PM in the church a simple setting of a circle of chairs and candles will accompany us as we meet, listen, pray, sing. We enter into quiet space and take time to hear God, for God longs to speak to us.

We hope you'll be there.
