"Self-fulfillment, Jesus says, comes through letting go, relinquishing our need to control and define, to manipulate and possess. Self-fulfillment comes through laying down our lives in obedience to God's deepest yearnings for us."

The above quote from Brother David Vryhof of the Society of Saint John the Evangelist in Boston, Massachusetts, seems very appropriate for the month of February as we lean into Lent.

"Lent" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word lencton – meaning "spring" or "lengthening" from the time of year when the days grow long. In 2021, Lent begins on Ash Wednesday (February 17) and ends with the Easter Triduum (Maundy Thursday through Easter Day), covering 40 days (excluding Sundays which are little feasts of the Resurrection). Some believe that the word "Lent" may derive from the Latin lentare, which means "to bend." This understanding reinforces a sense of Lent as a time of preparation for personal and collective transformation. Having nurtured ourselves through Advent, Christmas and Epiphany, Lent becomes the time to look truthfully at ourselves and make changes.

This is our opportunity to take a look truthfully at ourselves and move into developing changes and growth. As we quiet ourselves during this Season, we listen more to the Holy Spirit, and the nudges that get our attention. We might consider our readings and take time to reflect and practice Lectio Divina (Holy Reading) during this time, reading a passage and asking "what catches my attention?" We might hold a time of quiet prayer as a discipline this Lent or participate with Centering Prayer.

However, we enter into this Season of reflection and self introspection with God, it is a time that we lay down our lives of busyness and bustle and let our deepest yearnings be attended. What is it that you long for? What is it that doesn't seem to be resolved or reconciled in your life?

Take this Season quietly and intentionally. Let the Holy Spirit guide you as you seek God and give God your heart, once again, to God's great Love. Peace be with you always.



# **Blessing of Hope**

So may we know the hope that is not just for someday but for this day here, now, in this moment that opens to us hope not made of wishes but of substance hope made of sinew and muscle and bone hope that has breath and a beating heart

hope that will not keep quiet and be polite hope that knows how to holler when it is called for hope that knows how to sing when there seems little cause hope that raises us from the dead not someday but this day, every day, again and again and again.

Jan Richardson, a writer, artist, and minister, writes blessings for all occasions. It seemed appropriate to include a blessing for this time of Lent and our reflection in this quiet time of the church. We are held in a waiting period. We are mindful of our own shortcomings and our heart's longing for something better. We are longing for something we cannot name and find Someone of whom we hope we know. It is a time in the Desert. It is a time in the dark. Yet, in this time of quiet and reflection, what is it that we hear as we respond to the Psalmist words, "Be Still and Know That I Am God?" As we are still, what do notice and celebrate? What gives us hope in this held time of God's Great Love?

## **Blessing the Desert**

Ask me what this blessing sounds like and I will tell you about the wind that hollows everything it finds.

I will tell you about locusts who chose this night to offer their awful, rasping song.

I will tell you about rock faces and how it sounds when what was sturdy and solid suddenly shears away.

But give me long enough, and I will tell you also

how beneath the wind, a silence, not of absence or of agony that leaves all speechless and stricken when it comes, but of rest, of dreaming,

of the seed that knows its season and the wordless canticle of stars that will not cease their singing even when we cannot bear to hear.
