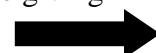
The Names and Titles of Our Saviour

Sunday school is getting ready to start!

Registration forms will be available beginning August 28th; located on the round table in a basket that says "Sunday School".

Our first day of Sunday school is September 11th, at the 10:15 service. Read on for information about each age group.

- **Nursery** is available for infants and children through age 6. The Nursery is located in the Sunday School Building and open from 10:00-11:45 AM.
- **Sunday School** is presented for children ages 7-13. The children begin their day in church at 10:15, then dismissed with the teachers following the processional. After class, the children will return to church for Communion. We will have a kick-off breakfast for the Sunday School Class on the first Sunday, September 11. We look forward to seeing you!
- **High School and College Christian Education**
  - We will now meet twice a month only (the 1st and 3rd Sunday) for 1 hour following the 10:15 service. This will work best if the youth come up first for communion on Sunday School days and head down to the Sunday School room. The basic time for the class will be 11:15-12:15. We will have snacks so no one will miss out on coffee hour!

The reasoning behind the time change is to allow the youth to participate in their different roles (Acolyte, worship band etc.) without it conflicting with Sunday School and the chance for them to hang out with their peers. We are looking forward to seeing what will happen this year and what God will do through the youth of St. Francis. See you all on September 18th!

We are all excited about the new year and the opportunity to meet or reunite with our students.
