From our Vicar.... September 2018

Recently in a sermon preached by David Kitch, he referred to many interpretations of the well known scripture, the Five Loaves and Two Fish. (John 6:1-21) This scripture is often referred to as the Miracle of the Feeding of the Five Thousand. Indeed, it may have been something supernatural, that so many people were completely satisfied by this boy's lunch, or it may have been a communal miracle that each one contributed what they had and everyone was fed. Either way it is a miracle indeed and God's blessing over the people. As David shared, this story is in every Gospel and seemed significant that the Gospel writers and the Holy Spirit wanted to make sure we got the message, that God's provision and faithfulness is always present to us! Divine Grace is something we can experience.

What does this mean to us at St. Francis as we begin to look at the Fall and this next year?

As you know we are blessing a couple of families from St. Francis to other areas for their life. We are indebted to these families who have faithfully served, ministered, and Graced St Francis with their time, talents, and treasure. We will miss them greatly!!!!!

It is also an opportunity for us as a community to consider what the needs are in their absence.

David preached about five aspects of Divine Grace and God's Provision that help us understand what we are preparing for in the Fall.

<u>The first aspect is a need.</u> With these families moving on, there is a need for ministry roles they filled, serving as LEM's and Lectors, on the Altar Guild, and ministering to the community through their time and talents. There is a need of the financial pledge they faithfully fulfilled to St. Francis and their support of the many ministries St. Francis takes part.

<u>The second aspect is an offering.</u> In considering the need of the gap these people leave behind, we are aware of what we can offer to continue the work of St. Francis and what we can contribute. It may be time serving alongside our Jr. Warden, Dan McCarty and Sexton Chrissy Bowden, to help with repairs, planting our landscape, giving time to the daily needs here. It may be offering our prayers for the community, or visiting those who are shut in and unable to attend services to bring Communion. It may be our tithes and making a pledge to St. Francis of our resources to sustain the grounds, buildings, and ministry aspects of our mission.

It may be assisting Brainerd, Esther and Elizabeth with the Website. It may be offering to visit those who are part of our community but are no longer able to be with us for Sunday Worship. They are still very much a part of our church family, and love to hear about all that St. Francis is doing!!!! They receive The Franciscan monthly and offer prayers and resources even if they are unable to be with us. We remember especially Dianatha Ain and her husband Bob, as we print her poems each month in the newsletter.

The fifth aspect is overflow. We worship a God of Abundance, and live in the overflow of God's Grace, Provision, and always LOVE. We are blessed in such abundance beyond ourselves and it is a part of the flow of the Kingdom of God and story of redemption that we are invited to participate with God!!!! We see the fruits of this overflow every time we know of a person's life restored through the ministry of the Samaritan Center. 
Men's Group

Two new books that will be in the library soon are <u>The Dressmaker's Dowry</u> by Meredith Jaeger and the <u>Whistling</u> <u>Season</u> by Ivan Doig. Both would make great summer reads. Jaeger links present day San Francisco with the San Francisco of the 1860s. It is a timely book about immigrant dressmakers and how their lives connect through the sons of the same family. The Spiritual Journey

An eight-month voyage of spiritual exploration and growth: September 2018 - May 2019



What is the Spiritual Journey program?

The Spiritual Journey is an eight-month program that supports participants in exploring their spiritual lives in a small group setting, deeply enriching their relationship with God/Spirit and helping them recognize the ways that God is present and working in their lives. Through Journey, you can experience contemplative ways of paying attention to your life, cultivate awareness of your growing relationship with the Holy, sample varied forms of prayer and reflection, and experiment with new ways to converse about spiritual experiences. A trained facilitator guides members in developing their skills in deep listening and personal discernment. Participants are introduced to the deep and expansive practices of spiritual formation, the ancient practice of spiritual direction, and a process of discernment for the next steps in their spiritual journey. And for those who feel called, the beginning of a three year journey in becoming a spiritual companion in Stillpoints' Art of Spiritual Direction program.

Who should come?

The Spiritual Journey Program is open to people of all denominations and faiths who are seeking to go deeper in their spiritual walk. We are rooted in the Christian tradition and we welcome a diverse and inclusive learning community.

What is the commitment?

The program consists of eight five-hour sessions that meet once a month. Sessions include practice in forms of prayer and contemplation, time for personal reflection, sharing in pairs and triads, experience-based learning, and group discussion of readings.

When and where does it happen?

Classes begin on Saturday, September 15, 2018, with future dates to be calendared with the group. Small groups are planned for Simi Valley, West Hollywood, Pasadena, Riverside, Claremont.

What does it cost?

The tuition of \$400 includes all materials (except books) plus a non-refundable \$25 application fee.

How do I register?

You may apply online at *stillpointca.org/spiritual-journey* or return the printable form downloaded from the website. You will then be invited to an interview with staff.

Registrations are due in July; class size is limited but will remain open until spaces are full.
