

As I pondered the question "What does it mean to be rich towards God," I thought of the many relationships here at St Francis that visibly display the love and glory of God around us. We are a community that is rich toward God and we have much to share. Please continue to participate with your time, talents and treasure as we respond with Gratitude for all that has been given to us that we may give to others. We are eager to see the continued development of all that God is doing as we live into the Fall Season. There is much ahead for us and we open our hands in willingness to say "yes" to this invitation of Great Love!!!











A couple of weeks ago we heard part of this text:

"But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?' So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God." -Luke 12:19-21

I wish to include a reflection on this Scripture, as we turn towards what is important in the next season of our community life together. It is as follows:

"What does this mean, "rich toward God"?

When I pay attention to the present moment, I feel God lavishing riches upon me. Paying attention, I suppose, is letting myself be rich toward God.

In this moment: the scent of earth still clinging to me after weeding the lavender.

The still, cool air on my skin.
Ginger tea warming my throat.
The robin's clear dawn melody.
First shafts of sunshine pouring through the trees on the east side of house.

I've had a few friends who, when they were dying, or having nearly died, immersed themselves in deep gratitude. Gratitude - not that they are dying of course - but grateful that dying awakened them to life. They lived at the last knowing the preciousness of every moment. Friendships appreciated. Shedding bad relationships and habits. Not so much ambitiously "making the most" of the remaining time, but summoning love toward life each moment. Not so much checking things off an extravagant bucket list, as admiring the symmetry of the bucket itself. Even in diminishment, enlarging the capacity to love.

Being rich toward God seems to me to be more about consciousness than bustling around the church managing God's business. Noticing the scent of lavender and earth and early morning and still being grateful for it by the end of the day. Noticing the other: taking risks in love for Love disguised as the unlovable."

Bishop John Harvey Taylor and Canon Kathy O'Connor are pleased to invite all members of the diocesan community to the second annual Bishop's Concert, featuring Grammy Award-winning singer, actor and author Debby Boone, on Friday, October 11 at the Episcopal Residence, located at 3435 E. California Boulevard in Pasadena.

Debby Boone is known for the 1977 hit "You Light Up My Life" (watch and listen to a 2013 performance here), her 1980 country song "Are You On the Road to Lovin' Me Again," and albums of country music, contemporary Christian songs, and songs for children. In 2005 she released *Reflections Of Rosemary*, an album featuring music that her mother-in-law, Rosemary Clooney, performed as well as other songs that Boone felt reflected the woman her family knew. Boone also has appeared in many musical theater productions, television series and movies, and has written several children's books illustrated by her husband, the Rev. Gabriel Ferrer, vicar of St. Martin's Church, Winnetka.



Seeking a deeper path? Spiritually hungry for more? Looking for companions? Stillpoint invites you to join others for a Spiritual Journey.

What is the Spiritual Journey program?

An eight-month exploration of your spiritual life in a small group setting, deeply enriching your relationship with The Divine and helping you recognize the ways that God/Spirit is present and working in your life.

What is the commitment?

The program consists of eight five-hour sessions that meet once a month. Sessions include practice in forms of prayer and contemplation, time for personal reflection, sharing in pairs and triads, experience-based learning, and group discussion of readings.

What does it cost?

There is \$25 application fee + a \$400 tuition fee which includes all instruction, facilitated group interaction, and private sessions with faculty (does not include books).

Who should come?

This program is open to people of all denominations and faiths who are seeking to go deeper in their spiritual walk. We are rooted in the Christian tradition and welcome a diverse and inclusive learning community.

When and where does it happen?

Classes begin on Saturday, September 14, 2019, with future dates to be scheduled by each group. Small groups are planned for Claremont, Orange County, Pasadena, Riverside, Simi Valley, and Studio City.

How do I register?
